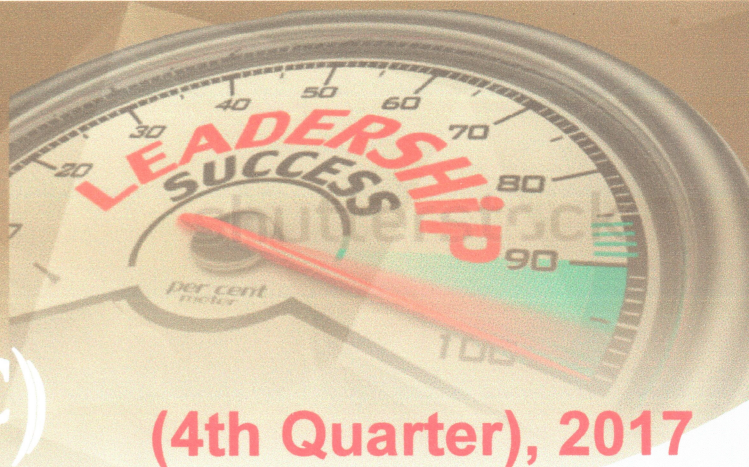


Policy Strategy & Leadership Course (PSLC)
